## Guidelines

1. Entries are limited to Lemhi County grown products and must be grown by exhibitor.
2. **NEW!** Limit of 20 entries per person (due to limited exhibit space).
3. **NEW!** 1 entry per class or variety per person (except where noted).
4. All articles should be cleaned and prepared for exhibit prior to entry.
5. In general, DO NOT REMOVE roots, Trim stems to 1"-2".
6. Entries to be judged on uniformity, lack of defects, and condition (i.e. smooth, unblemished surfaces, free from worm holes or disease). Entries also judged on form typical for variety, most acceptable commercial size and color). In general entries will be judged on the kind of vegetable or fruit a customer shopping for produce will prefer.
7. Entries must meet exhibit guidelines (count, type, etc.).
8. Please fill out open class entry form prior to check in.
